

# Find a Navigator in Your Region!

Navigating the mental health and addiction system can be challenging, especially when other health and social systems intertwine. A Navigator can help you and your family understand the system and find appropriate support in your community. System navigation may also be a core part of other programs and services such as case management or Family Health Teams. Checkout the different navigation programs or services across Ontario:

## **Northwestern Ontario**
